 - “To what extent and under what conditions does the collective impact approach contribute to systems and population changes?”

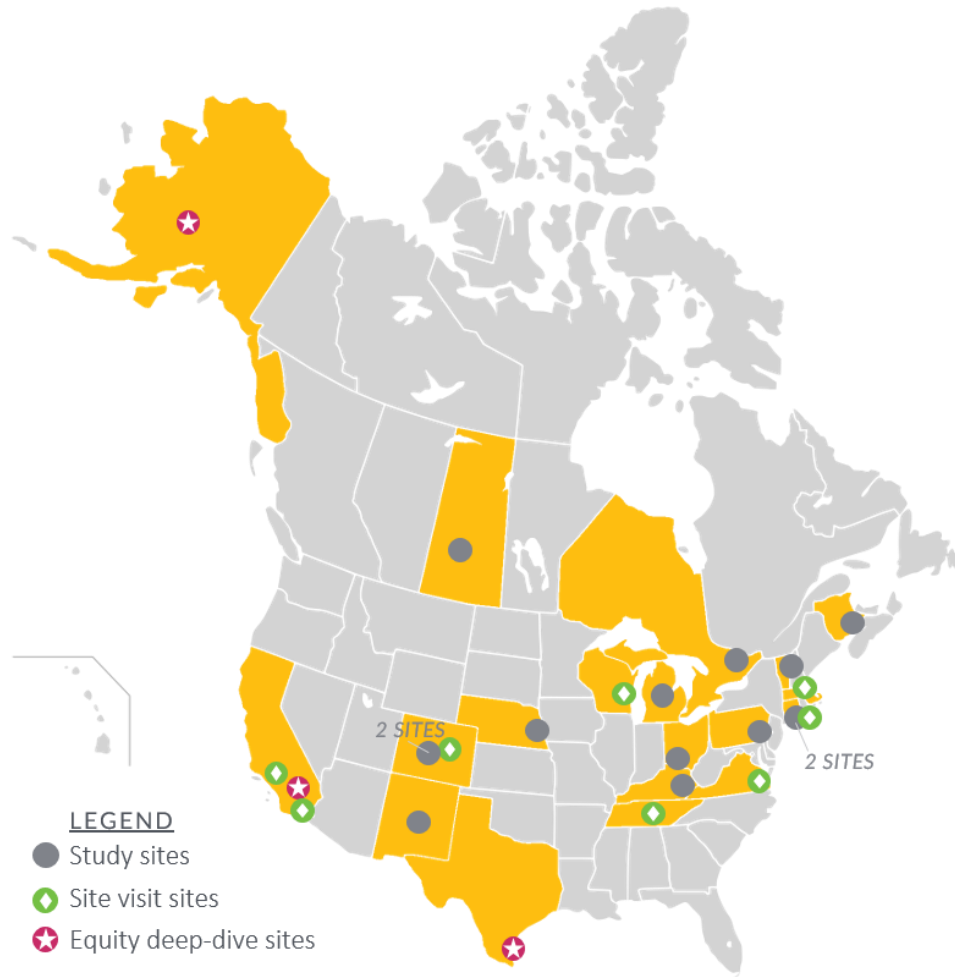

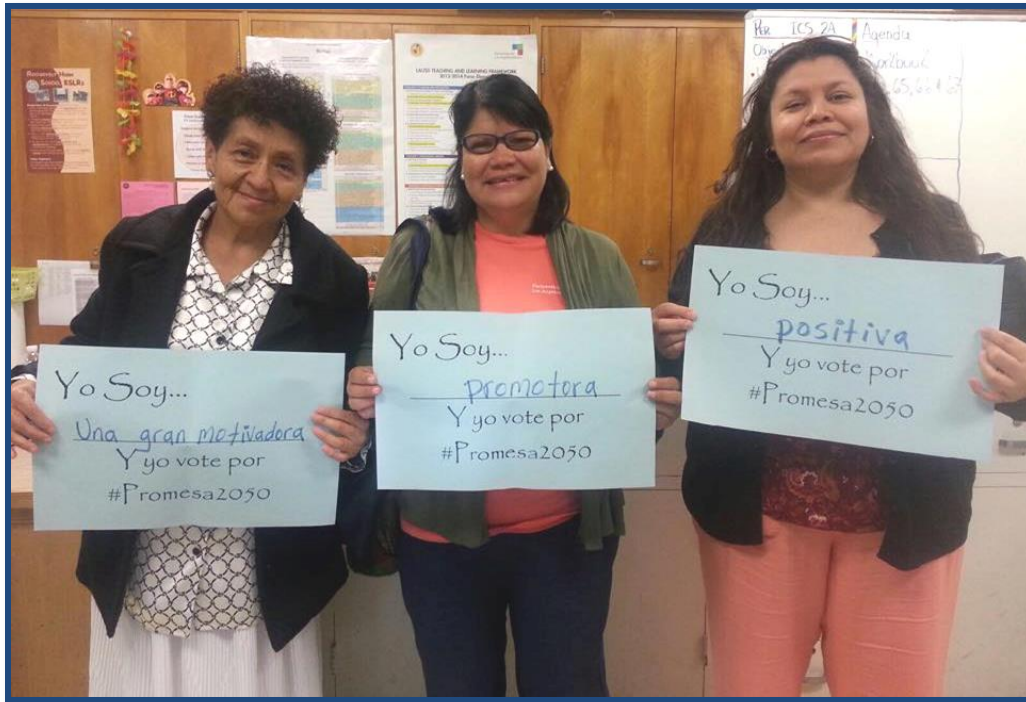

Families can live stable, healthy & fulfilling lives.



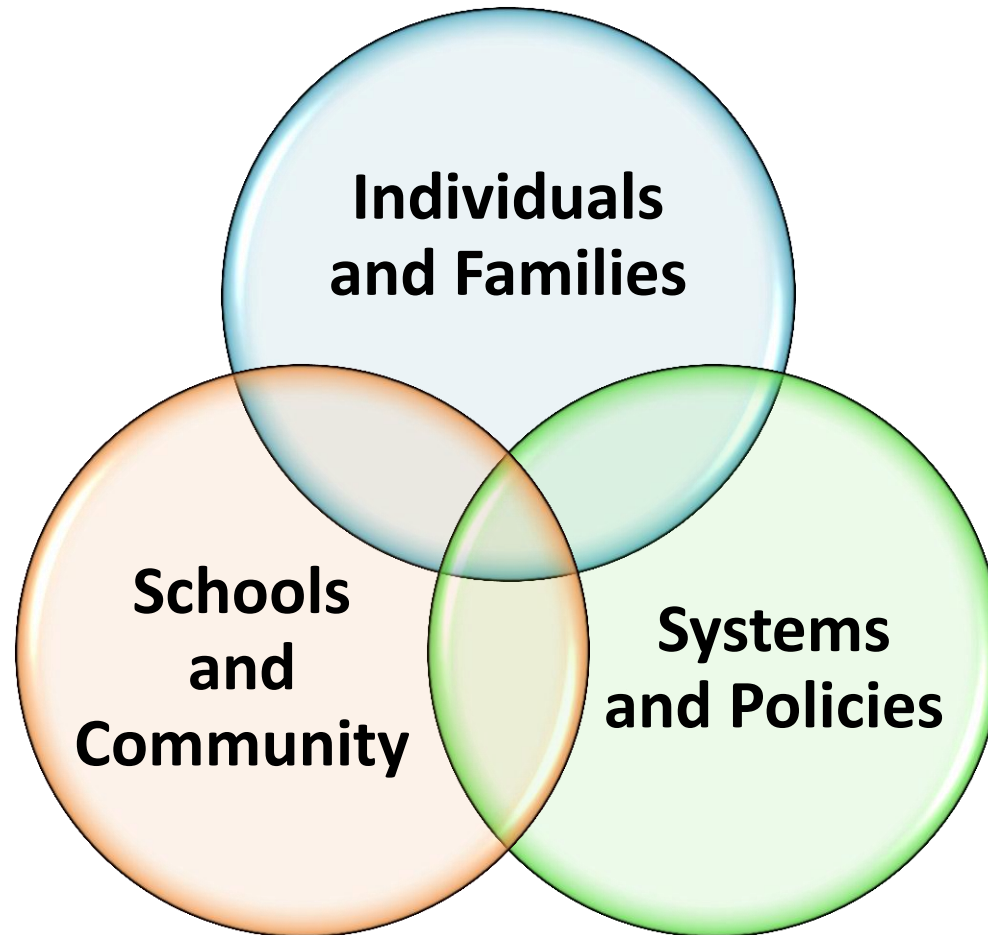

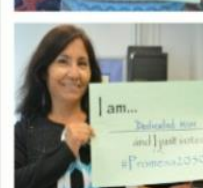
