
## Define Equity

"Equity is fairness and justice achieved through systematically assessing disparities in opportunities, outcomes, and representation and redressing [those] disparities through targeted actions," Adapted from Urban Strategies Council\*



## Factors Influencing Equity Work: National, State and Local Contextual Factors

Equity efforts at the local level are heavily influenced by the interplay of national, state, and local dynamics. It is within this intersection that multi-sector place-based collaboratives are working to advance equity.



- Judicial Decisions
- Legislative policy
- Administrative policy
- Narratives
- Media
- Socio-cultural and political context
- Inter-relational dynamics


## Community Collaboratives Are Adapting In the Face of Challenges

- New Partnerships: Collaboratives have had to be agile, adjust course with new foci of their work, and forge new partnerships
- Language and Communications: Collaboratives are considering what language, framing and narrative work is strategic in their context
- **Data:** Some collaboratives are using disaggregated data to identify needs, target programming and make the case for continuing the work, yet are working through challenges when demographically identified data is not available
- **Burnout**: Given the challenging work of collaboration, many people in the social sector are experiencing burnout for a variety reasons: the nature of the work itself, ongoing economic / funding challenges, racial reckoning, and the pandemic. An increase in attacks on equity further intensifies this burnout for folks leading equity work.
- Relational Work: Building skills to repair trust and bridge across differences.
- **Policy and Legislative Advocacy**: Leveraging statewide networks to share community experiences and responses to sociocultural challenges, aiming to identify themes that can inform statewide policy and advance local work.
- Strategic Partnerships: Collaboratives are recognizing the importance of developing strategic partnerships with others in the social change ecosystem such as organizers, advocates, and movement builders.

## Many Types of Support Are Needed by the Field

- Guides and frameworks to help practitioners assess the equity environment, identify key conversations, forge strategic partnerships and identify strategies to move the work forward in their context
- Legal support to navigate continuing to focus on equity
- Training and capacity building on a range of topics including:
  - •Understanding advocacy possibilities and limitations for nonprofit organizations
  - Facilitating difficult conversations related to equity
  - •Training and fluency in bridging strategies and practices
  - •Data analysis when disaggregated data is unavailable
- Public communications and narrative change, training and consultancies
- Wellness for leaders engaging in this work
- Peer Learning and Connection to learn and be in supportive community with others navigating these
  headwinds
